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Management's Responsibility

To the Members of Tallcree First Nation:

Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the accompanying schedule of remuneration and expenses, including responsibility for significant accounting judgments and estimates in accordance with the First Nations Financial Transparency Act created by Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada. This responsibility includes selecting appropriate accounting principles and methods, and making decisions affecting the measurement of transactions in which objective judgment is required.

In discharging its responsibilities for the integrity and fairness of the schedule of remuneration and expenses, management designs and maintains the necessary accounting systems and related internal controls to provide reasonable assurance that transactions are authorized, assets are safeguarded and financial records are properly maintained to provide reliable information for the preparation of financial information.

Chief and Council is composed entirely of individuals who are neither management nor employees of the First Nation. The Chief and Council are responsible for overseeing management in the performance of its financial reporting responsibilities. The Chief and Council fulfils these responsibilities by reviewing the financial information prepared by management and discussing relevant matters with management and external accountants. The Chief and Council are also responsible for recommending the appointment of the First Nation's external accountants.

MNP LLP is appointed by Chief and Council on behalf of the members to review the schedule of remuneration and expenses and report directly to them; their report follows. The external accountants have full and free access to, and meet periodically and separately with, both the Chief and Council and management to discuss their review engagement results.

Notes to the Financial Information
For the year ended March 31, 2016
(Unaudited)

1. Basis of accounting

This financial information has been prepared using the required presentation and financial reporting provisions of the First Nations Financial Transparency Act, which does not require all of the same disclosure and presentation that would be required under Canadian public sector accounting standards. The remuneration reflects only salaries, wages, commissions, bonuses, fees, honouraria and any other monetary and non-monetary benefits paid to the elected members of Chief and Council. The expenses reflect costs of transportation, accommodation, meals, hospitality and incidental expenses. The amounts presented in the financial information are based on the March 31, 2016 Tallcree First Nation consolidated financial statements which have been prepared in accordance with Canadian public sector accounting standards and reference should be made to those audited consolidated financial statements for complete information.
